

How to grow Foxgloves



Items needed:

Sowing tray

Soil

Foxglove seeds

Garden trowel

Watering can

Fill your seed tray with
compost.

Do not over fill.



When opening your seed packet be careful as the seeds are tiny.



Pour a small amount of
the seeds into the palm of your
hand.



Sprinkle these seeds over one section of your seed tray.



Using your fingers push gently on the seeds so they go into the soil.



Water the seeds.



Within a few weeks your seedlings will start to appear.



When the seedlings are big enough they will need to be thinned to allow the seeds room to grow.





Water your foxgloves every day.

When your plants are big enough
they will be ready to plant
outside.



Your foxgloves can be planted out
in the Autumn.
These plants will flower in the
following year.





Use a trowel dig a small hole.



Remove your foxglove from its
pot.



Put the plant in the hole and draw the soil around the plant and press down.



Water your foxgloves every day.
