

Egg Decorating Activities

We've all painted an Easter Egg before... but have you tried some of these wacky decorating ideas?

Shaving Cream Eggs

What you will need:

- Shaving cream
- Hard-boiled eggs or Fake Eggs
- White vinegar
- Food colouring
- Paper towel or tea towels
- Toothpicks or skewers

Method

1. Hard-boil the eggs and allow them to cool completely
2. Submerge the eggs in a vinegar bath for about 30 minutes. This helps them to absorb colours better.
3. Fill a bowl with shaving cream and add food colourings to it to make the colour you desire.
4. Play around with the colours with different bowls of shaving cream.
5. Swirl the tones with a skewer or tooth pick.
6. Sink the eggs in coloured shaving cream and roll them in it.
7. Repeat for all the eggs
8. When you're satisfied with the coating leave them to settle for 45 minutes.
9. Then wipe away the excess foam.





Sharpie Easter Eggs

What you will need:

- Hard-boiled eggs or Fake Eggs
- Easter themed shaped stencil (stickers/cut outs)
- Sharpie

Method

1. Hard-boil the eggs and leave to cool completely
2. Attach an Easter themed sticker or DIY cut-out to the egg
3. Using a sharpie, decorate around the sticker how you wish – we like this spotty design!





Sprinkles Easter Eggs

What you will need:

- Pastel Sprinkles
- Hard-Boiled Eggs or Fake Eggs
- Tacky Glue
- Paintbrush
- Spoon

Method

1. Pour sprinkles into a good sized bowl.
2. Cover your egg with a good layer of glue using the paintbrush.
3. Roll your eggs carefully in the sprinkles.
4. Once eggs are completely covered use a spoon to press the sprinkles on, effectively 'sealing' the layer of sprinkles.
5. Leave egg to dry there and take out when completely dry!





Marbled Eggs

What you will need:

- Nail Polish in Varying Colors
- Tupperware
- Slotted Spoon
- Wooden Skewer
- Hard-boiled eggs or fake eggs

Method

1. Fill a bowl with cold water and add a few drops of nail polish. Note, the order in which you add the polish will vary how the colour marble.
2. Swirl the colours with a skewer.
3. Carefully submerge the egg in the water then quickly remove with the slotted spoon.
4. Set aside to dry.
