This home currently has two available flats, each thoughtfully designed for comfort and functionality:

- **Ground-floor flat:** Features a bay-windowed bedroom with an ensuite (toilet, sink, shower), a spacious lounge with a built-in cupboard, and a separate kitchen equipped with an oven, induction hob, and sink. The kitchen has a door leading to a private garden area.
- First-floor flat: Accessible via stairs or a lift, it includes a bedroom with a built-in wardrobe and en-suite, plus an open-plan lounge and kitchen with modern appliances.

Both flats have easy-to-clean lino flooring throughout.

A brief overview of the home:

This home is a large property divided into eight self-contained flats across three levels: four on the ground floor, three on the first floor, and one on the second floor. A lift provides access between the ground and first floors. While there's a spacious garden with a striking willow tree, the tenancies cover the flats only, not the garden. The home can be lively due to tenant activities, including music and behavioural noise. There are no communal areas, as each flat is independent. Support is provided as tenants settle into their routines.

The home is conveniently located just a 2-minute walk from the beach and a 15-minute stroll to the town and pier. The nearby town features arcades, shops, and several supermarkets, including Morrisons, B&M, Iceland, ALDI, and LIDL, making it easy to access daily necessities and enjoy leisure activities.
