Supporting people who are D/deaf

We offer specialist support to people in the D/deaf community with opportunities to connect with others and positively promoting D/deaf culture.

Every D/deaf person we support has unique needs and goals, so every person receives tailored support, which they shape. We learn about a person's health, physical and emotional needs, how they want to be supported, and their goals and interests. We then pull out all the stops to support them to achieve their aims through our Wheel of Engagement.

Many of the team members who work in our homes for the D/deaf community are Deaf. British Sign Language and lip reading is the first language in these homes: our teams use it as well as other strategies to communicate with people in their preferred way.

Our homes and outreach services support D/deaf people to develop their skills, fulfil their aims and live as independently as possible. We support with BSL language skills, life management skills, and money management skills.

We appreciate that many families cannot sign, so we keep lines of communication open, enabling family connections and avoiding isolation. Our emphasis is on providing a fun, family home feel with a holistic approach to support that involves families and the wider community.

We provide short and long-term support. We are able to support with rehabilitation after surgery or hospital stays, holiday placements and even palliative and end-of-life care.

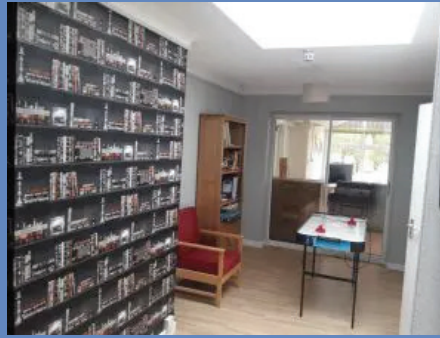

Forest View, Supported Living, Hampshire

Forest View is a supported living home for adults with learning disabilities, hearing impairments, emotional needs and/or autism spectrum conditions. The home provides a safe and accessible environment, and the majority of the team members have hearing loss themselves.

Individuals will receive person-centred active support so they are engaged in meaningful activity and relationships as an active participant. People are supported to have control over their lives, making meaningful choices and increase independence.

Forest View is a large two-floor house with five bedrooms with wet rooms attached so individuals can have their own space. When people want to socialise with others, there is a large living room, dining room, conservatory, and outside garden space for them to access.

Roper House is a specialist residential home without nursing in Canterbury, Kent, that provides 24-hour support to 27 D/deaf and/or deafblind people over the age of 50. People we support have a range of diverse and sometimes complex needs, including learning and physical disabilities, mental health problems and dementia.

The team at Roper House aims to support the people who live at our home to gain the knowledge and skills they need to reach their potential. We empower people to develop their independence, establish and/or improve their communication skills, maintain their personal health and wellbeing and develop social and leisure interests.

Roper House is within easy reach of the centre of Canterbury, the Kent coast and countryside. We're close to shops, restaurants, pubs, cinemas and theatres, as well as the railway station, with connections to the Kent coast, Ashford, Maidstone and London.
